This position is ideal for an individual who is passionate about hockey, youth engagement, and fair play. The Referee will oversee gameplay during program sessions, enforce rules fairly and consistently, and support positive sportsmanship among participants aged 12–17 years.

Working closely with program staff, coaches, participants, and families, the Referee will help ensure that all games and activities are conducted safely, respectfully, and in alignment with the program's goals of accessibility, teamwork, and youth development.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Officiate hockey games and scrimmages in accordance with program rules and safety standards
- Ensure fair play, sportsmanship, and respectful conduct among participants
- Enforce game rules consistently and professionally
- Monitor player safety and respond appropriately to incidents or conflicts during games
- Communicate effectively with coaches, participants, and program staff regarding gameplay and conduct
- Assist with setting up and organizing game schedules and activities
- Ensure all health and safety protocols are followed during program sessions
- Support an inclusive and positive environment for all youth participants
- Maintain professionalism and impartiality while officiating games
- Report incidents, injuries, or concerns to the Program Supervisor and Youth Department Manager
- Assist with equipment checks and ensure playing areas remain safe and organized

- Perform other duties as assigned

Qualifications and Requirements

- Knowledge of hockey rules, gameplay, and sportsmanship principles
- Previous refereeing or officiating experience in youth sports is preferred
- Passion for youth development and community sports programming
- Strong communication and conflict resolution skills
- Ability to remain calm and make fair decisions in fast-paced situations
- Leadership skills and ability to work effectively with youth aged 12–17 years
- First Aid and CPR certification is considered an asset
